The Role Of The Governing Board

The Governing Board of all schools are made up of volunteers from parents, staff and members elected from the Local Authority.

The Governing Board of any school has 3 core functions:

1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
2. Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff;
3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

At Firs Farm the Governing Board works closely with the Headteacher and Senior Leaders to support the school with its' continuous drive to provide the latest strategies and developments for the children.

Within the Governing Board there are 3 sub committees which focus on Premises/ Health & safety, Curriculum and Staffing, and Finance. The Governing Board and any sub committees meet termly with a clear agenda set. Minutes from the Full Governing body are published on the school website for the community to view.

Governors are regular visitors to the school undertaking Learning Walks to validate school judgements.
