

Safer Internet Day and Workshops

At Firs Farm, we took part in Safer Internet Day on Tuesday 6th February. This included watching videos about how to stay safe online, taking part in emoji games (discussing how and when it is appropriate to send certain emoji's), playing an active part in assemblies and confirming who to talk to if we ever see anything that is upsetting online.

The children discussed the 5 golden things you NEVER share online:

- Name
- Age
- Address
- School
- Email/password/phone number

They also spoke about who they could talk to if they wanted to report something:

- Trusted adult
- NSPCC
- CEOP
